Opening and Evening Psalm

The priest censes the holy altar table in silence, as a memory of the silence in which the Holy Spirit brooded over the formless waters just before creation (Genesis 1:2).

(**Deacon:** Bless Master!)

Priest: Glory to the holy consubstantial, life-creating,

and undivided Trinity, now and ever and unto

ages of ages!

Choir: Amen! Come let us worship God our King ...

(As the priest censes the entire church, the choir sings the great Psalm of Creation -- Evening Psalm 104, "Bless the Lord O my Soul.")

The Great Litany

Priest: In peace let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

- For the peace from above and for the salvation of our souls, let us pray to the Lord.

Little Litany

Priest: Again and again in peace, let us pray to the Lord.

Priest: In the evening and in the morning and at noonday, we praise You, we bless You, we give thanks to You, and we pray to You, O Lord of all: Direct our prayer before You as incense, and incline not our hearts to words or thoughts of wickedness; but deliver us from all who seek after our souls. For to You Lord, O Lord, do we lift up our eyes, and in You have we trusted. Put us not to shame, O our God. For Yours is the majesty, and Yours is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory: of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

Lord I Call (Tone 6)

(With a great censing. As a reminder of the Fall of Adam and Eve, we proclaim Psalms 141, 142, 130, 117. The sung verses are meditations on the themes of the Feast.)

Choir: Lord, I call upon You, hear me. Hear me, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You hear me. Receive

the voice of my prayer. Lord, I call upon You. Hear me, O Lord.

Let my prayer arise, in Your sight as incense. And let the lifting up of my hands, be an evening sacrifice. Hear me, O Lord.

Reader: Set a guard over my mouth, O LORD, keep watch over the door of my lips! Incline not my heart to any evil, to busy myself with wicked deeds in company with men who work iniquity; and let me not eat of their chosen ones!

Let a good man strike or rebuke me in kindness, but let the oil of the wicked never anoint my head; for my prayer is continually against their wicked deeds.

When they are given over to those who shall condemn them, then they shall learn that the word of the LORD is true. As a rock which one cleaves and shatters on the land, so shall their bones be scattered at the mouth of Sheol.

But my eyes are toward thee, O LORD; in You I seek refuge; leave me not defenseless! Keep me from the trap which they have laid for me,

and from the snares of evildoers! Let the wicked together fall into their own nets, while I alone pass through.

[Psalm 142] I cry with my voice to the LORD, with my voice I make supplication to the LORD, I pour out my complaint before him, I tell all my trouble. When my spirit is faint within me, You know my way! In the path where I walk they have laid a trap for me.

I look to the right and watch, but there is none who knows me; no refuge remains to me, no man cares for my soul. I cry to You, O LORD; I say, You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living. Give heed to my cry; for I am brought very low! Deliver me from my persecutors; for they are too strong for me!

Reader: Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name.

Choir: The grace of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it / today has as<u>sem</u>bled us. / Taking up Your <u>Cross</u> we sing: / "Blessed is He that comes in the <u>Name</u> of the Lord! // Hosanna in the <u>high</u>est!"

Reader: The righteous await me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Choir: (Repeat: "The grace of the Holy Spirit ...")

Reader: [Psalm 130] Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord! Lord hear my voice.

Choir: Today the Word of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, / the Coe<u>ter</u>nal Son, / Whose throne is heaven and Whose <u>foot</u>stool is earth, / humbles Himself and comes from <u>Beth</u>any, / riding on a dumb beast, the <u>foal</u> of an ass. / The children of the Hebrews hold <u>branch</u>es in their hands. / They praise Him <u>cry</u>ing out: / "Hosanna in the <u>high</u>est! // Blessed is He that comes, the King of <u>Is</u>rael!"

Reader: Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications.

Choir: (Repeat, "Today the Word of God the Father ...")

Reader: If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Choir: O new Israel, church of the <u>Gen</u>tiles, / assemble today and sing with the Prophet Zecha<u>ri</u>ah: / "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of <u>Zi</u>on! / Shout for joy, O daughter of Je<u>ru</u>salem! / Behold, your King is <u>com</u>ing to you! / He is meek,

bearing sal<u>va</u>tion. / He rides on the <u>colt</u> of an ass." / Celebrate with the children, holding <u>palms</u> in your hands: / "Hosanna in the <u>high</u>est! // Blessed is He that comes, the King of <u>Is</u>rael!"

Reader: For Your name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word, my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Choir: (Repeat: "O new Israel ...")

Reader: From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord.

Choir: By your command, O Loving Lord, / You raised Lazarus Your friend from death. / His flesh had been given over to corruption. / He was in the power of death four days. / By this, You foretold Your holy Resurrection for us. / Today, You mount an untamed colt as Your chariot, / foretelling the conversion of the Gentiles. / Your beloved Israel offers You a hymn of praise / from the mouths of innocent children, / as they see You enter the Holy City, O Christ, // six days before the Feast of Passover.

Reader: For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Choir: (Repeat: "By Your command, O Loving Lord ...")

Reader: [Psalm 117] Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Choir: Six days before the Feast of <u>Pass</u>over / Jesus entered <u>Bethany</u>. / His disciples <u>asked</u> Him: / "Where should we prepare for You to eat the <u>Pass</u>over?" / He answered: "When you have entered the <u>city</u>, / a man carrying a jar of water will <u>meet</u> you. / Follow him into the house which he <u>enters</u>, / and tell the <u>mas</u>ter of the house: / 'The Teacher <u>says</u> to you: // Here I shall eat the Passover with my dis<u>ci</u>ples.'"

Reader: For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endured forever.

Choir: (Repeat: "Six days before the Feast of Passover ...")

Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Choir: The grace of the Holy <u>Spirit</u> / today has as<u>sem</u>bled us. / Taking up Your <u>Cross</u> we sing: / "Blessed is He that comes in the <u>Name</u> of the Lord! // Hosanna in the <u>high</u>est!"

Reader: Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Choir: The grace of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it / today has as<u>sem</u>bled us. / Taking up Your <u>Cross</u> we sing: / "Blessed is He that comes in the <u>Name</u> of the Lord! // Hosanna in the <u>high</u>est!"

Evening Entrance -- O Gladsome Light

(The clergy exits the north deacon's door and stands before the Royal Doors. Although sin enters the world through Adam after creation, we rejoice in the "Gladsome Light" of Jesus Christ, who dispels the darkness and brings salvation. Also known as the Lamplighting Psalm, O Gladsome Light is the hymn which coincided with sunset. During this hymn the candles in church were lit to fight back the darkness.)

Priest: Wisdom! Let us attend!

Choir: Gladsome Light of the holy glory of the

immortal Father: Heavenly, holy, blessed O

Jesus Christ! Now that we have come to the setting of the sun, and behold the light of evening, we praise God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. For meet it is at all times to worship You, with voices of praise, O Son of God and Giver of Life! Therefore all the world glorifies You!

Prokeimenon of Sunday and Old Testament Readings of the Feast

Priest: Let us attend. Peace be unto all!

Priest: Wisdom. The prokeimenon in the 6th tone: The Lord is King, He is robed in majesty.

- The Lord is robed. He is girded with strength.
- For He has established the world that it shall never be moved!

Reader: The reading is from Genesis.

Reader: (Genesis 49:1-2, 8-12) Then Jacob called his sons, and said, "Gather yourselves together, that I may tell you what shall befall you in days to come. ² Assemble and hear, O sons of Jacob, and hearken to Israel your father. 8 Judah, your brothers shall praise you; your hand shall be on the neck of your enemies; your father's sons shall bow down before you. ⁹ Judah is a lion's whelp; from the prey, my son, you have gone up. He stooped down, he couched as a lion, and as a lioness; who dares rouse him up? 10 The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until he comes to whom it belongs; and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples. 11 Binding his foal to the vine and his ass's colt to the choice vine, he washes his garments in wine and his vesture in the blood of grapes; 12 his eyes shall be red with wine, and his teeth white with milk.

Reader: The reading is from Zephaniah.

Priest: Let us attend.

Reader: (*Zephaniah 3:14-19*). ¹⁴ Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem! 15 The LORD has taken away the judgments against you, he has cast out your enemies. The King of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst; you shall fear evil no more. 16 On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: "Do not fear, O Zion; let not your hands grow weak. ¹⁷ The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing ¹⁸ as on a day of festival. "I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. 19 Behold, at that time I will deal with all your oppressors. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in

Reader: (Zechariah 9:9-15) 9 Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on an ass, on a colt the foal of an ass. ¹⁰ I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. ¹¹ As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your captives free from the waterless pit. 12 Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double. ¹³ For I have bent Judah as my bow; I have made Ephraim its arrow. I will brandish your sons, O Zion, over your sons, O Greece, and wield you like a warrior's sword. 14 Then the LORD will appear over them, and his arrow go forth like lightning; the Lord GOD will sound the trumpet, and march forth in the whirlwinds of the south. ¹⁵ The LORD of hosts will protect them, and they shall devour and tread down the slingers; and they shall drink their blood

(As the clergy move to the "porch" -- or, more commonly, to the west end of the Nave -- the choir sings the Litya verses.)

The <u>Word</u> of God Who has no beginning: / the Father's Coeternal Son, / today comes to the city of Jerusalem, / enthroned on a dumb beast, the foal of an ass. / The <u>Cherubim are afraid to gaze upon Him, / yet the children honor Him with palms and branches. / The Spirit inspires their song of praise: / "Hosanna in the highest! Hosanna to <u>David's Son, // Who has come to save mankind from error!"</u></u>

Six <u>days</u> before the Feast of <u>Pass</u>over, / Your voice resounded in the depths of <u>hell</u>, O Lord, / <u>rais</u>ing Lazarus who had been <u>dead</u> four days. / Then the children of the <u>He</u>brews <u>danced</u> and sang: // "Hosanna to our God! <u>Glo</u>ry to You!"

(Tone 2). You have entered the Holy <u>City</u>, O Lord, / riding on the <u>colt</u> of an ass, / <u>has</u>tening to Your <u>Pas</u>sion, / that the Law and the <u>Proph</u>ets might be fulfilled. / The Hebrew children greeted You with palms and <u>branches</u>, / <u>her</u>alding Your victorious Resur<u>rec</u>tion. // Blessed are You, O Savior! Have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

Glory to <u>You</u>, O Christ, / en<u>throned</u> on high! / To<u>day</u> we lift up Your <u>pre</u>cious Cross, / as we await Your coming in <u>glory</u>. / The daughter of <u>Zion</u> is glad; / all <u>na</u>tions on earth rejoice; / the children wave branches; the disciples make a <u>car</u>pet of clothes. / All the ends of the earth learn to <u>cry</u> to You: // "Blessed are You, O Savior! Have <u>mer</u>cy on us!"

(Tone 3). For the protection of this holy house, and for those who abide therein; for the peace and quietness of the whole world; for the welfare of God's holy churches; for the salvation and assistance of our fathers and brethren who, with diligence and in the fear of God, do labor and serve; For those who are absent and abroad; for the healing of those who lie in sickness; for the repose, refreshment, blessed memory and remission of sins of all our devout fathers and mothers, brothers, sisters, and children, Orthodox believers departed this life before us who here, and in all the world, lie asleep in the Lord;

For the deliverance of captives; and for all our brethren who are taking part in these ministrations, and for all who minister and have ministered in this holy house, let us say.
